
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

## European Product Registry for Energy Labeling

The European Product Registry for Energy Labeling (EPREL) is defined in the EU Regulation 2017/1369 to provide important energy efficiency information to consumers. Together with Energy Labeling Regulation ELR (EU) 2019/2015 which was amended by regulation (EU) 2021/340 for energy labelling of light sources, manufacturers are required to declare an energy class based on key technical specifications from each of their product and register it in an open data base managed by EPREL It is now a legal requirement for a vendor of light sources to upload information about their products into the EPREL database before placing these products on the market in the EU.

Table 3 below provides a list of part numbers that are in compliance with ELR and are currently listed in the EPREL database.

Figure 1: Drive Current vs. Voltage V6B HD<sup>2</sup>




Figure 3: Typical Relative Flux vs. Current V6B HD1,2





Figure 5: Typical DC Flux vs. Case Temperature<sup>3</sup>

Figure 2: Drive Current vs. Voltage V6G HD<sup>2</sup>





Figure 4: Typical Relative Flux vs. Current V6G HD<sup>1,2</sup>

Figure 6: Typical DC ccx Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>4</sup>




Figure 8: 2700K, 97 CRI Color Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>1</sup>





Figure 10: 3500K Class A Color Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>1</sup>

Figure 7: Typical DC ccy Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>4</sup>




Figure 9: 3000K, 97 CRI Color Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>1</sup>



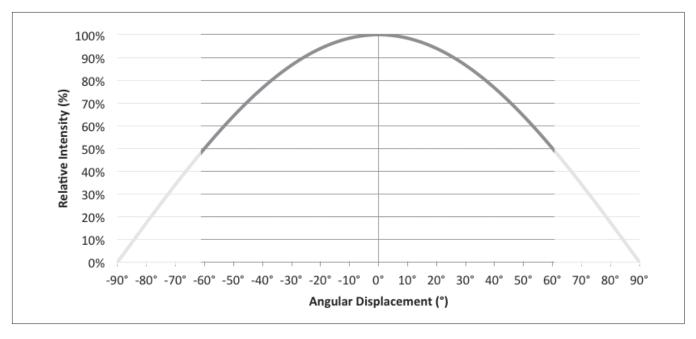


Figure 11: 3000K, 90 CRI Color Shift vs. Case Temperature<sup>3</sup>


Figure 12: Typical Spatial Radiation Pattern




Figure 14: Typical Color Spectrum

Figure 15: Typical Color Spectrum for Décor Series



Figure 16: Drawing for V6 HD LED Array


